During the spring of 2022, thirty industrious high school students participated in the Westchester Region NAACP ACT-SO Regional Competition. Despite the continued COVID 19 restrictions that prevented them to compete in person, the students demonstrated their skillful talents on video via a zoom communications event platform. Of the thirty participates, eight students received gold medals qualifying them to compete at the 45th National NAACP ACT-SO Competition. The competition took place July14th through the 17th of this year in Atlantic City, New Jersey. The Westchester Region ACT-SO gold medalists displayed mastery of their competitive skills, alongside 500 other students from across the country.

Spencer Augustine-DANCE - Senior, Denzel Washington School of the Arts. Norfolk State University in the fall.

Isaiah Dempson – ORIGINAL ESSAY – Senior, Port Chester High School. Alfred State College, (September of 2022).

Standing in lieu of gold medalist Isaiah Dempson, who was unable to attend the competition, Original Essay's silver medalist, Ilana Rahim-Braden competed in his place.

Congratulations to Anna Mkandawire who received a gold medal in STEM, receiving a \$2,000 monetary award, Naysa Boswell, a bronze medal in Dramatics, receiving a \$1,000 monetary award and Spencer Augustine, a bronze medal receiving a \$1,000 monetary award. In addition to their monetary awards, all three of the medalists will also receive tech prizes that will consist of an iPad, AirPods and an Oculus Virtual Reality System.

The Westchester Region is also delighted to announce that this year, Lancôme Cosmetics USA, partnered with the NAACP and ACT-SO to grant 40 scholarships to the next generation of women with their "Write Her Future Scholarship Fund." The fund is designed to empower female students of color through literacy and education as well as mentoring and entrepreneurship opportunities.
